Interestingly enough, the book of Hebrews actually summarizes the events of the book of Exodus as an example of faith: **Heb 11:23-29**

Chapter 1

Opens with the genealogy of the children of Israel thru the 12 sons of Jacob. _____ have passed since they went to Egypt because of the famine. Joseph had earned favor with Pharaoh and his family was blest because of it. As time passed, eventually that fondness faded with new leadership (v8)

Chapter 4

A reluctant Moses is reassured that the Lord will work powerfully on his behalf to convince the Israelites that God sent him. Moses returns to Egypt, met by his brother Aaron and introduced to the elders where he rehearses God's _____ for the Exodus.

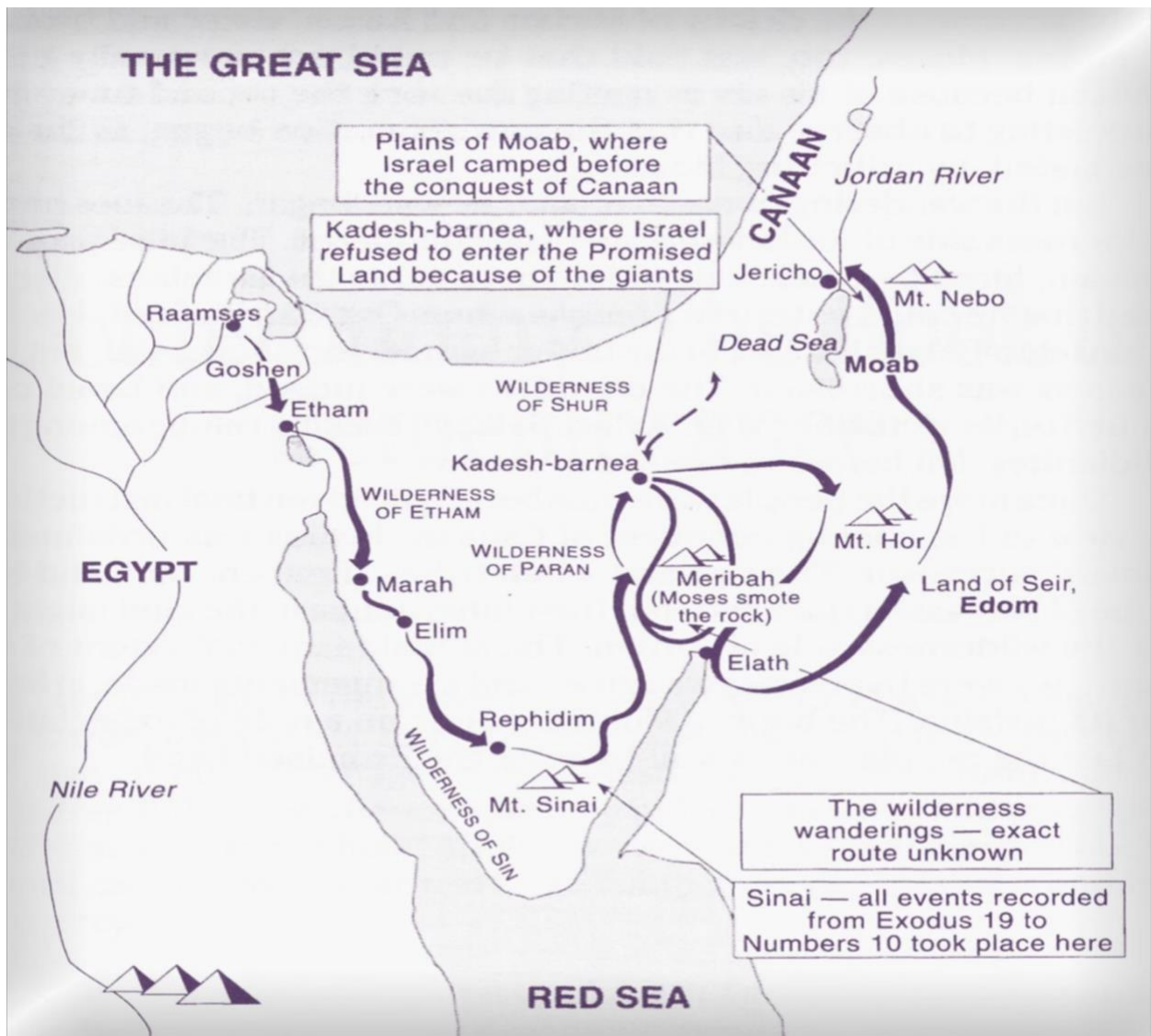
Chapter 5-12

Chapter 13

Before the final plague of the death of the firstborn, as protection from the plague God required the death of a lamb and its blood was spread around the door frame of their home. This was an expression of substitutionary death by the lamb and faith by the family. Doing this _____ the death angel from taking the firstborn child of that family. It would be named Passover and become a yearly holiday to be recognized and celebrated. They would also institute an observance of their Exodus by commemorating a 7 day feast of unleavened bread every year at the same time. Leaven symbolizes sin in scripture. When the Lord removed them from Egypt, they were removed from a godless society, immersed in sin. Chapter ends with God leading his people, as a cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night, toward the land he promised them earlier.

Pharaoh pursues the children of Israel to the _____, they cross as God parts the waters and the armies of Pharaohs are destroyed there.

Chapter 15

Chapter starts with a victory song from the Red Sea event. They travel three days without _____ arriving at Marah, where they find water that is bitter and undrinkable. They murmur against _____, who prays to the Lord for direct. God instructs him to cast a tree into the waters, which he does, and they are made drinkable. The Lord uses it as a lesson to inform the people that if they will obey him, he will protect them from such diseases as came upon the Egyptians.

Chapter 16

The journey continues as they arrive at Elim. Now there is a food shortage, they murmur again at Moses. They are introduced to God's provision of manna, which would feed them until they entered Canaan. They are _____ for the murmuring, God taking it personal.

The journey continues to Rephidim, and again they find themselves without water. They confront Moses again. Moses smites the rock and water is supplied to the people. Chapter 25-31

The Lord speaks to Moses on the top of the mountain concerning the following; an offering to be taken for the future building of the tabernacle. Instructions are given on the tabernacle, its furnishings, the priesthood and their consecration, as well as a census tax. In chapter 31 men with great craftsmanship skill are appointed to lead in building all things pertaining to the tabernacle. Chapter ends with the Moses receiving the 10 commandments in 2 stone tablets, written with the _____ of God.

Chapter 32

The people revert to the idol worship they had witnessed in _____ in Moses absence, aided by Aaron his brother and supposed fellow leader. They asked Aaron to make them a golden calf and he complied. They had broken the law before it was even delivered to them. 3000 died because of this sin. Upon Moses seeing this, he casts the tablets to the ground breaking them. He returns to the mount and communes with God, seeking forgiveness for Israel's sin.

Chapter 33

They are commanded to leave Sinai for the promised land. Moses has a Tabernacle erected _____ the camp, enters it and the presence of God shows up there as well. In the tent Moses seeks Gods instruction on leading the children to the promised land.

Chapter 34

God tells Moses to make two new tablets with the commandments on them and meet him back on top of the mountain. He ascends the mountain, meets with God, sees his Glory, has the covenant renewed and comes down with the glory of God _____.

Chapter 35-39

Moses now takes what God had relayed to him on the mountain and communicates it to the _____ on the following issues: regulations about the Sabbath day, contributions which are to be collected for the tabernacle and the actual construction of the tabernacle, it's furnishings and the priestly garments.

Chapter 40
