Chapter 8

Daniel has a second vision. Here is what bible scholars believe is symbolized in the dream.

_____ – Representing Persia with the two horns representing the kings of Media and Persia. The taller horn represents the Persian king, who would be more powerful. His conquest reaches in all directions.

Dan 8:4 I saw the ram pushing westward, and northward, and southward; so that no beasts might stand before him, neither *was there any* that could deliver out of his hand; but he did according to his will, and became great.

______ – Representing Greece comes from the west. Has one conspicuous horn between his eyes (Alexander the Great). The goat defeats the ram. Biblical historians believe that the four notable horns that come up represent the 4 parts the kingdom were divided after Alexander died.

______ (very important) – represents Antiochus Epiphanes who rose from the third empire to rule the Syrian divison. He prefigures the Antichrist. Matter of fact, both figures are weaved into end time prophsies under the title "little horn." This is an obstacle in interpretation. In Daniel 11:-21-35 are greater details about the exploits of Antiochus Epiphanes. However in 11:36 the subject shifts to the future activities of the Antichrist. The angel ______ is sent to interpret the vision for Daniel. The vision was so perplexing that Daniel was ______ for days.

Chapter 9

By now Daniel is trying to piece together a timeline for when the Jews may be released from the Babylonian captivity. He references the book of _________to do so and discovers that God had initially appointed them to seventy years captivity. Daniel moves into a time of prayer and confession (v3-23), knowing this time is almost fulfilled and ask God to keep his promise. When Gabriel appears again with bad news. Their time in captivity would be extended to ______ because of the depth of their iniquity.

7 weeks – The first span of "7 weeks" cover from the Issuing of the command to restore and rebuild Jerusalem (Nehemiah 2:1-8) by Artaxerxes UNTIL the Messiah the Prince (Specifically the death of Christ at his first advent)

62 weeks – From the Death of Christ until the "time of the Gentiles" is complete.

***Important note – There is a time gap between the 69th & 70th week. It's the church age which starts at Pentacost and continues until the Rapture. This was concealed in the OT and is why Paul referred to it as a "_____."
