There are several twists to the book of Jonah. We see the wisdom of God contradict the wisdom of man. In Jonah's wisdom maybe he didn't want to go to Nineveh because he was afraid they would ______ and be spared. He wanted them to be destroyed and knew God would eventually do so because of their wickedness. Maybe it was because of how they had treated his ancestors in days gone by or maybe he thought their destruction would the judgement of Israel. On the other hand we see the wisdom of God. Sending Jonah there first to evangelize them would soften the nature of the way they and benefit Israel in the process.
