They were hired by the government to assess and collect taxes and they would add a to the bill which would be their wage for the job. They were some of the most despised people in the community because often they would add an unfair amount to the bill. The Gospel of Matthew (as well as Mark and Luke) gives us first-hand account of his Matthew belonged to the priestly tribe of Levi.
