This is the final letter Paul would write, not just to Timothy but to anyone. He's writing it several years after the first letter, under a sentence of incarceration, in
We also don't know if his incarceration is in an actual Roman prison (2 Tim 4:13-15) or is he on house (Acts 28). Paul is in the middle of his court trial and it doesn't look good for him, so this letter is written with several things in mind. Timothy is still serving the church in Ephesus and Paul wants to Timothy to carry on the work, to give further on ministry related issues and the ask him to come
