| Date: Around AD 95–96, during the reign of Emperor Domitian. |
| Audience: The of Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey): Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamos, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, and Laodicea (<i>Rev. 1:4, 11</i>). |
| Rev 1:4 John to the seven churches which are in Asia: |
| Situation: Christians were facing persecution, both state-sponsored (emperor worship) and local hostility. The church also struggled with false teaching, compromise, and spiritual decline. |
| John received the vision "on the Lord's day" while "in the Spirit" (Rev. 1:10). |
